"Would be great to get a shop and camomile family to take over for family orientated activities which is much needed in the area"

"We love bingo. I'm disabled so I don't go out and about very often so it would be nice to have something local to us"

"Camomile Café taking over the community centre could be a life line for many residents that live locally near the currently vacant community centre along with other residents in the Corsham community. This would also create a great link to the Corsham schools especially Broadwood."

"Some community revitalisation is needed and an open community centre and shop would be great"

"This is a must to get this opened and let Rudloe be a vibrant community again"

"Retaining the Community Centre with the fantastic provision put forward would provide opportunities on an array of levels to so many different people"

"We are about to start a family and the community centre would be great for me to meet other people & get involved"

"A local building for classes, meetings etc is important as not everyone can access Box village for these"

"I do feel it is important to have a local meeting place but most important is a shop of reasonable size within walking distance. We have nothing here at all."

"Rudloe NEEDS A COMMUNITY CENTRE and with the arrival of many more people to the area, I am sure that a fully functioning meeting place as suggested would be a welcome asset"

"People need somewhere close to meet and make friends. Young families and old people feel very isolated if they have no central meeting place, especially if they have no car or don't drive."

"To me, option 2 makes sense. To demolish a building which is sound seems madness when the cost is considered"

"Option 3 would give the community what it needs. This option is a very good idea. Excellent news if it all goes through."

"The community centre could be the hub of Rudloe, similar to Selwyn Hall in Box and the Springfield Centre in Corsham"

"I have lived around Rudloe all my life. Retaining the Community Centre and Green is in my opinion essential for the community to have a meeting place and a safe place to play and exercise. The Camomile Family proposal would allow many different interest groups to use the centre facilities."

"Box Parish Council should take on the Community Centre and refurbish it with S106 money, then rent it to Camomile and other interested parties"

"I would like to see a shop for essentials as I use a scooter because of my disabilities. Having to go into town or garage sometimes is an effort if you're not well. Also like to see a community centre for

various activities for all ages. A meeting place for people like me who are new to the area and don't know anyone."

"With all the house building in the area, no thought has been given to other amenities for people to join in as a community. I would really like to see the community centre back in use. Having a small shop would be a bonus."

"SAVE THE GREEN + COMMUNITY CENTRE!!!" The Community Centre will provide a hub for our local people providing services across all generations. A community needs to thrive + most importantly survive. The Camomile proposal will unite the community and thus reach out to those that can be supported through the vast range of interventions, enriching our community for generations to come."

"I would welcome the community centre being reopened by a group such as Camomile Family offering facilities for our community. This would help to build a real sense of belonging."

"It was sad to see the Community Centre close". I used the Club when it was in the old building and in the new one also."

"I have lived here for 38 years. A cafe or place to meet is needed, run by the right people like Camomile. Several families have young children and don't drive; also there are elderly residents that find it difficult to get around. Let's bring Rudloe back to its glory days."

"Rudloe needs some kind of shop, a meeting place to get together, somewhere for the kids to play. Most of all we need Rudloe back to how it used to be, a safe and friendly place."

"The importance of keeping Rudloe Community Centre cannot be underestimated. It's a very important part of the local community along with the green space. It would be a tragedy to demolish the heart of the community. Also a shop is very important for the community especially for the elderly."

"Any 'community' use of the existing centre is preferable to more development and the loss of space. This has already happened when the old club was demolished and the new one built! If Camomile is prepared to take it on then they must be given the opportunity!!!"

"There is a desperate need for the Community Centre to be retained and reopened as described by Camomile. Also reopen the old shop. We always used the shop for 'convenience things'."

"It would be very useful to have a shop especially when the weather is bad in the winter"

"We need more facilities for older people. We like living in Rudloe. We would like to meet with others so we won't be so isolated. A lot of the elderly don't drive, also it's a trek to the bus stop."

"Rudloe seems to be going backwards in time. We have always had a social club and shop on Rudloe since I moved here in 1955. Now we have got nothing. No Community Centre, no shop, nothing."

"A step in the right direction. Rudloe appears to be forgotten. There is nothing for the youngsters here, or for anyone. Reopen the shop on the estate; in the right hands it could be a gold mine. The

Green has been here a lifetime and should remain. The community hall has so much potential for young and old; youth club, bingo, the list is endless. I support your project."

"The statistics presented on the second page of the leaflet are a stark reminder of the lack of investment by Box Parish Council in the Rudloe community. A simple and cost effective solution would be for Box PC to work with Wiltshire Council in order to arrange for the three assets (Community Centre, Green and shop) to be transferred to Box PC. The Community Centre could be let to Camomile Family."

"What do we have at Rudloe for the community, simply nothing! We are deprived of many facilities to support the community. Allowing GreenSquare to build more houses and take away the Green will only add to this feeling of deprivation. The west of Corsham has seen a large number of housing developments without supporting social infrastructure."

"It is difficult to envisage a bright future for Rudloe when you have councils who do not respect the views of its residents. However, after I have read and re-read your brochure, I have come to the conclusion that Camomile Family have the answer."

"The Community Centre would benefit so many families in the area"

"I am very pleased to know that there is a proposal to keep Rudloe Community Centre for the community it was built for. Many local people fought for years to get it built. It would be a big mistake to demolish the one facility we have, building more housing and taking away the only green space and any possibility of thriving community clubs and activities. I fully support the development of the Community Centre to provide facilities for residents of all ages. With the increased population from all the surrounding housing developments, a facility like this is essential."

"The school can only take on so many more children with the houses being built. A shop in our area would be a great help as if we need items we have to use car, bus or walk and sometimes that's difficult or impossible for older residents and people with disabilities."

"We are pleased to hear that at last something is going to happen to the social club. It would be so nice to have so many things to look forward to as there is nothing for the residents at all."

"It would be disgraceful to knock down the Community Centre and build houses on the site. Where can the children play and meet up? Corsham, Box and Neston have parks and halls. Children in Rudloe will have nothing. Camomile are successful in the High Street and need to expand. BRING THEM TO RUDLOE."

"The Camomile Family proposal would seem a lifeline for old and young alike, with a little shop for everyday essentials and so many different interest groups catered for. Let's all hope for the future!"

"I have to confirm that this would be a real asset for Rudloe community, being so close to the primary school, with parking and green space this can only be positive. We would also make great use of this facility with 2 children under 3."
